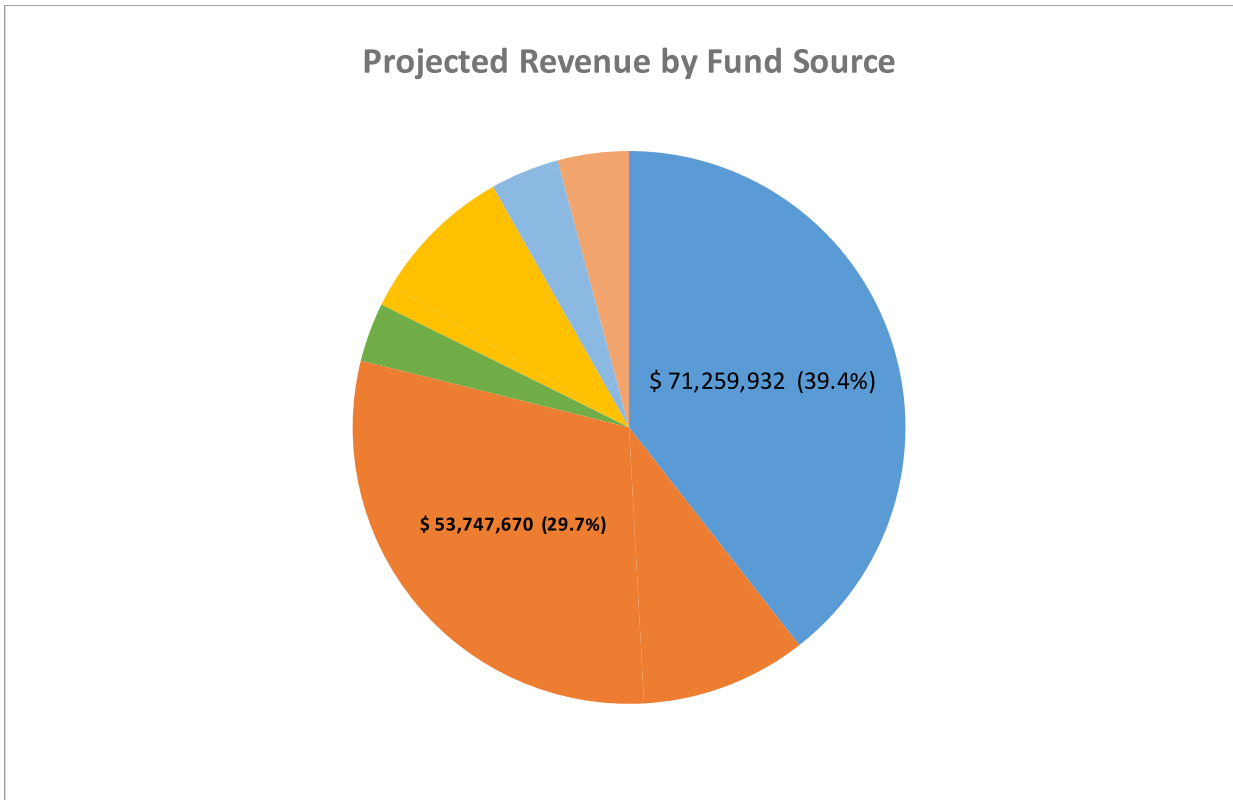

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

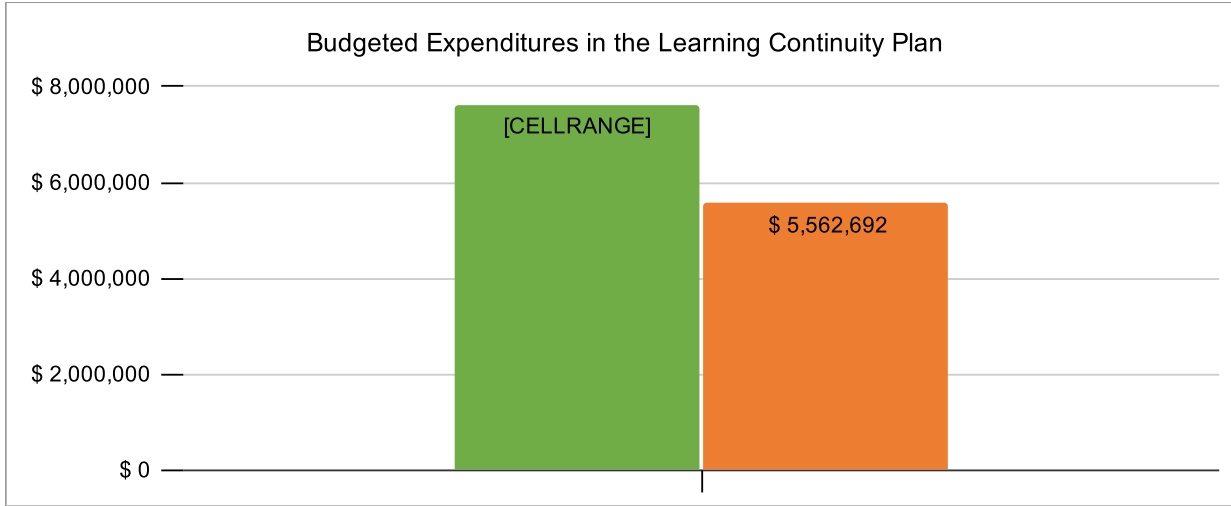
Budget Overview for the 2020-2021 School Year



This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Dinuba Unified School District expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The total revenue projected for Dinuba Unified School District is \$94,603,671.87, of which \$71,259,932.00 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) funds, \$6,231,182.89 is other state funds, \$2,303,402.98 is local funds, and \$14,809,154.00 is federal funds. Of the \$14,809,154.00 in federal funds, \$7,532,841.00 are federal CARES Act funds. Of the \$71,259,932.00 in LCFF Funds, \$17,512,262.00 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

For the 2020-21 school year school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Learning Continuity and Attendance Plan (Learning Continuity Plan). The Learning Continuity Plan replaces the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) for the 2020–21 school year and provides school districts with the opportunity to describe how they are planning to provide a high-quality education, social-emotional supports, and nutrition to their students during the COVID-19 pandemic.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Dinuba Unified School District plans to spend for planned actions and services in the Learning Continuity Plan for 2020-2021 and how much of the total is tied to increasing or improving services for high needs students.

Dinuba Unified School District plans to spend \$90,924,426.49 for the 2020-2021 school year. Of that amount, \$7,629,806.00 is tied to actions/services in the Learning Continuity Plan and \$83,294,620.49 is not included in the Learning Continuity Plan. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the Learning Continuity Plan will be used for the following:

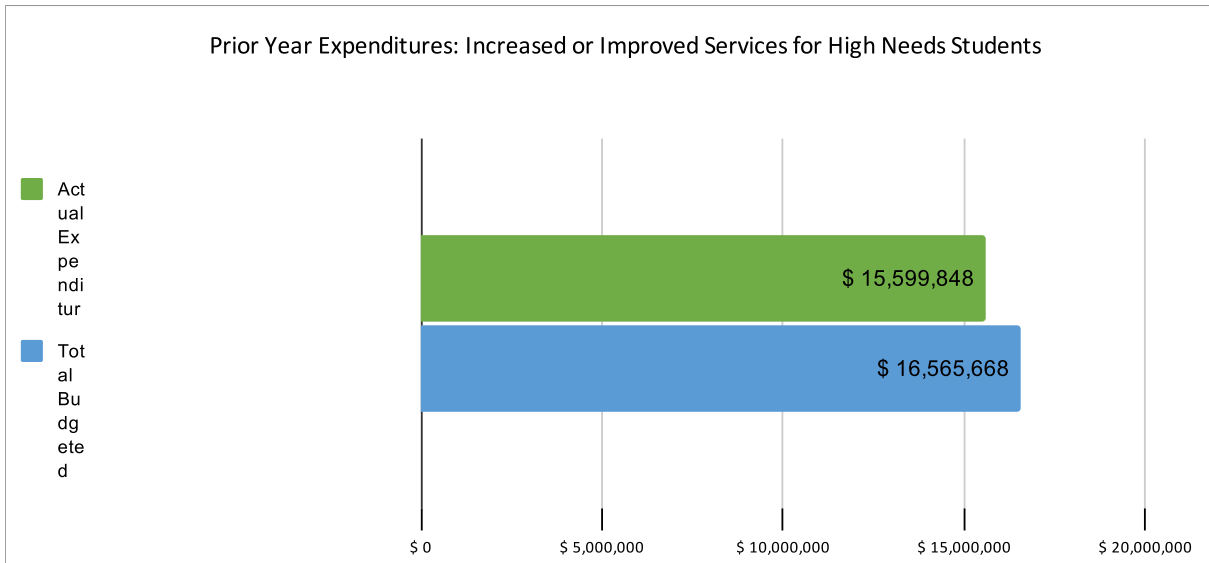
Other funding resources support personnel in the following areas in support of LCAP goals: teaching staff, custodial and maintenance staff, some instructional staff, and some clerical support staff. Additionally, these resources support College & Career and Professional Development activities.

Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in in the Learning Continuity Plan for the 2020-2021 School Year

In 2020-2021, Dinuba Unified School District is projecting it will receive \$17,512,262.00 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Dinuba Unified School District must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the Learning Continuity Plan. Dinuba Unified School District plans to spend \$5,562,692.00 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the Learning Continuity Plan. The additional improved services described in the plan include the following:

Dinuba Unified continues to fund services such as those highlighted above. Supplemental funds are also allocated to the sites where they are used to support the high needs populations through such things as learning supports, interventions, school safety, parent involvement, enrichment, and school culture. We continue to work to support the social emotional needs of students.

Update on Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in 2019-2020



This chart compares what Dinuba Unified School District budgeted in the 2019-20 LCAP for actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students with what Dinuba Unified School District actually spent on actions and services that contributed to increasing or improving services for high needs students in the 2019-20 school year.

In 2019-2020, Dinuba Unified School District's LCAP budgeted \$16,565,668.00 for planned actions to increase or improve services for high needs students. Dinuba Unified School District actually spent \$15,599,848.00 for actions to increase or improve services for high needs students in 2019-2020. The difference between the budgeted and actual expenditures of \$965,820.00 had the following impact on Dinuba Unified School District's ability to increase or improve services for high needs students:

While the schools closed during March of 2020, Dinuba Unified was able to provide most of the planned services. However, activities and services such as enrichment fieldtrips, after school interventions, end-of-year awards and celebrations, etc. were impacted.
