The IMPACT Intern Credential Program is designed for individuals to complete their California Preliminary Teaching Credential while teaching as a teacher-of-record. The Tulare County Office of Education and a consortium of local school districts partner to educate and employ teachers through the IMPACT Program. The program is fully accredited by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC). Interns completing the program are recommended to the CTC for a preliminary credential and are eligible to teach anywhere in California.

Pathway to a Preliminary Credential

INFORMATION MEETING

Attend an *Information Meeting* either in-person at the Tulare County Office of Education or online via Zoom.

ADVISEMENT MEETING

Attend an *Advisement Meeting* with IMPACT Program staff. Bring all required documents in order for staff to determine eligibility to enter into the program.

FRAMEWORK FOR TEACHING

Complete the 165 hours of state-mandated pre-service coursework.

DISTRICT EMPLOYMENT

Secure district employment and provide IMPACT Program staff with a copy of employment contract.

DISTRICT INTERN CREDENTIAL

Program staff prepares intern credential application and submits application to the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing for approval.

INTERN CREDENTIAL COURSEWORK

Begin two-year education program for Single Subject, Multiple Subject, or Education Specialist Credential. Throughout the program, interns are supported by a caring program staff, highly qualified instructors and practicum supervisors, district and site administrators, and on-site mentors.

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ELIGIBILITY

- ▶ Bachelor's Degree
- ▶ Basic skills requirement (CBEST, ACT/ SAT scores, subject matter competency)
- ▶ Certificate of Clearance (current permit and credential holders meet this requirement)
- ▶ Subject matter competency (CSET or CTC-approved subject matter program)
- ▶ *Framework For Teaching* or other approved pre-service coursework
- ▶ U.S. Constitution (CSU graduates meet this requirement, undergrad transcript evaluation, or exam)
- ▶ Offer of employment from a partnering district
