Visalia: The Tulare County Office of Education is proud to present the 2002 Tulare County College Night on Monday, Sept. 9, 2002, from 6:30 until 9:00 pm at the Visalia Convention Center's Exhibit Hall. College Night is designed for students and parents who want to learn more about preparing for and applying to colleges. More than 90 university and college representatives will be on hand to answer questions about entrance requirements, tuition and housing. Financial aid and scholarship information will also be available.

Presentations and panel discussions will be held throughout the evening to allow visitors to learn about financial aid opportunities, college admissions and transfers, and foreign exchange programs. Scheduled sessions include: "Writing the College Essay," "Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) Preparation," and "Four Year Colleges and Universities: Planning for Admission." Several sessions will be conducted in Spanish, Hmong and Lao.
