union. Look closely and you'll even see bumper stickers on Visalia Police Department vehicles that

proclaim: "CHARACTER COUNTS!"

Although, here in Tulare County, thanks largely to County Superintendent Jim Vidak, that may just

seem like business as usual.

Since its introduction in Tulare County Schools in January of 1994, CHARACTER COUNTS! has

literally become a part of the moral landscape of Tulare County. Murals can be viewed on the walls of

Kaweah Delta Hospital, Burton and Alta Vista Elementary Schools in Porterville, Houston Elementary

School in Visalia, Goshen Elementary School, in Mooney Grove Park, Pixley Elementary School,

Golden Valley Elementary School in Orosi, Dinuba High School, and Kaweah Continuation High

School in Exeter. The Six Pillars themselves can be seen in the courtyard of Cherry Avenue Middle

School in Tulare. Pillar Square in Mooney Grove Park, the country's largest single permanent

monument to CHARACTER COUNTS!, has served as the venue for numerous events including over 40

weddings.
