Tulare County Office of Education Announces: Tulare County Student Receives Honorable Mention at State Science Fair

Kelsey Procter, an eighth-grade student from Springville Union Elementary, placed fourth in her division and received honorable mention at the State Science Fair in Los Angeles last week. The competition was held at the California Science Center and awards given May 25. Miss Procter competed with 23 other students from throughout the state in the Junior Division's "Aerodynamics/Hydrodynamics" category. Her project was entitled "What a Drag," and her science teacher was Mr. Chris O'Brien.
