Academic Decathlon 2006

Saturday, February 4, 2006 · Porterville College (Open to the Public)**

Tulare County Office of Education will once again host the Academic Decathlon, a ten-event, scholastic competition for teams of high school students. The event will take place Friday and Saturday, February 3-4, 2006. This year, twelve teams of Tulare County's best and brightest students from nine high school districts will compete. Schools entering teams are: Dinuba High School, El Diamante High School, Exeter High School, Farmersville High School, Granite Hills High School, Monache High School, Orosi High School, Porterville High School, Strathmore High School, Tulare Western High School, and Woodlake High School.

Each team has six to nine members who compete in ten grueling events in the Academic Decathlon. Team members test their knowledge of subjects including economics, mathematics, music, art, language and literature, and science. In addition, the contestants will present prepared and impromptu speeches, write an essay on a given topic, and be interviewed by a panel of judges. These events – which are not open to the public – are held on Friday at the Tulare County Office of Education's Doe Avenue Complex beginning at 9:00 a.m.
