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Tulare County Office of Education Announces: Trustee Rominger Completes Governance Program

To complete the Masters in Governance program, candidates must complete 56 hours of intensive training on the role of the governance team in setting the direction of the organization, student learning and achievement, school finance and facilities, human resources, setting policy, collective bargaining, and community leadership.

In addition to her responsibilities with the Tulare County Board of Education, Mrs. Rominger is an active member of other several other community organizations including serving as President

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of Tulare County Pan-Hellenic Society and as a member of the Acorn Garden Club.
