Annual Tulare County Science Olympiad

Divisions B and C: College of the Sequoias – March 10, 2012 Division A: El Diamante High School – April 21, 2012

Science Olympiad tournaments are rigorous academic competitions consisting of a series of individual and team events. These events encompass the science disciplines of biology, earth science, chemistry, physics and technology. There is also a balance between science facts, processes, skills and applications. Locally, hundreds of students compete in the annual regional competitions. The Science Olympiad is divided into three divisions: Division A (grades 3 - 6); Division B (grades 6 - 9); and Division C (grades 9 - 12).

The **Divisions B and C Competition** (for middle and high school students) will be held at the **College of the Sequoias in Visalia**, Saturday, **March 10, 2012**. Twenty-three Tulare County middle school teams and 14 high school teams are scheduled to compete. These teams represent 22 Tulare County schools. Students from sixth through twelfth grades will be launching rockets, piloting robotic vehicles, solving science crimes, designing experiments and participating in a variety of engaging scientific explorations. The Division B and C events begin with opening ceremonies at 8:20 a.m. Competitions will begin at 8:30 a.m. throughout the COS campus, with

the awards ceremony scheduled for 3:40 p.m. in the new gymnasium (orter Field House).

Individual and team awards are presented with the top four teams in the B and C divisions

advancing to the NorCal State Science competition. The 2012 NorCal State Science competition

will be held Saturday, April 14, 2012 at College of the Sequoias in Visalia.

Division A (for elementary school students) will be held at El Diamante High School, Visalia,

on Saturday, April 21. Students from third through sixth grades will be building circuits, testing

the elasticity of "gunk," dropping eggs to see if they survive, launching catapults and

participating in fun-filled science activities. The Division A event begins with an opening

ceremony on the El Diamante campus at 8:30 a.m. Individual competitions begin at 9:00 a.m.

Individual and team awards will be presented at 12:45 p.m.

"Science Olympiad is a very rigorous competition which demands a lot of preparation," says

Tulare County Superintendent of Schools Jim Vidak. "We appreciate the coaches and parents

who help prepare students for this event."
