## **Second Annual STEM Expo March 12**

Saturday, March 12, 2016 ▪ 8:30 am – 3:30 pm ▪ Tulare County Fairgrounds, 620 South K St., Tulare

The community is invited to celebrate everything about science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) at the annual STEM Expo March 12. Parents, students, teachers, local businesses and community organizations are invited to visit the Tulare County Fairgrounds for a day of live STEM demonstrations and activities. This free event is held in an “open house” format.

Students will bring their science projects to compete for top prizes and the chance to advance to the California State Science Fair in Los Angeles, May 23-24. Nearly 90 science projects have been registered in six competition categories: Life Science; Earth and Space Science; Physical Science – Chemistry; Physical Science – Physics; Engineering and Mathematics; and Behavioral and Social Sciences.

The STEM Expo provides students with fun, engaging activities to build knowledge about STEM, including the annual Science & Engineering Fair, a coding workshop, a robotics workshop and exhibition, a *FIRST* LEGO League demonstration and a maker space, where participants can learn to build several projects out of ordinary materials.

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“The STEM Expo is designed to engage students and families in learning about many of the educational and career opportunities in science, technology, engineering and mathematics,” said ERS’s Michelle French, a STEM/Project Based Learning staff development/curriculum specialist.

The highlight of the STEM Expo will be a presentation by Stuart Sumida, Ph.D., a paleontologist and comparative anatomist who teaches animal and human anatomy, ranging from the undergraduate to the medical level. Dr. Sumida is currently the Wang Distinguished Professor of Science, Mathematics, and Engineering for the California State University System. He is also Professor of Biology at California State University, San Bernardino.

Dr. Sumida is considered the world's foremost anatomical consultant to special effects artists and animators, having worked on over 50 feature-length films such as *How to Train Your Dragon*, *Mulan*, *Harry Potter* and *Kung Fu Panda*, for such groups as DreamWorks and Walt Disney Feature Animation, among others.

Dr. Sumida has written three books and published over 70-peer-reviewed articles focusing on the evolution of vertebrates, as well as the integration of science in the arts. He has received funding for his research from the National Geographic Society, NATO, the National Science Foundation, and numerous museums.
