Tulare County Office of Education Announces:

TCOE's Child Abuse and Neglect (C.A.N.) Prevention Program seeks adult volunteers

The Child Abuse and Neglect (C.A.N.) Prevention Program – operated by the Tulare County Office of Education – is seeking volunteers. C.A.N. is a prevention program designed to help reduce the incidence of neglect, as well as physical, emotional and sexual abuse. The program is seeking people who are comfortable in a classroom setting, available a few hours each month during the school year, and committed to child safety.

Linda Cemo is the project coordinator for C.A.N. She and a team of volunteers make classroom presentations to first- and fifth-grade children in Tulare County. The team presents to an average of 2,800 students per year. First-grade children see a 10-minute video and meet a hand puppet named Safety Sam. The fifth-grade presentations are more interactive. Following a separate video presentation, students discuss the situations presented in the film and how they can keep themselves safe. Both presentations have a similar message: children in a dangerous situation should say "NO!," then get away and tell someone they trust.
