### **Tulare County Office of Education Announces: Tulare County History Day Cherry Avenue Middle School, Tulare • March 23, 2002**

The Tulare County History Day event is scheduled for Saturday, March 23, 2002, from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at Cherry Avenue Middle School in Tulare. This event is part of a National History Day event sponsored by the Constitutional Rights Foundation. The competition is an exciting, history-based learning experience that allows students to apply what they learn by creating original productions. Students compete in six categories: historical paper, exhibit, performance, documentary, historical web site and poster.

The theme of the History Day event this year is **Revolution, Reaction and Reform**. Students research an historic event including its historical contexts (social, cultural, intellectual, physical, political and economic). They explore its differing perspectives, its causes, effects and then draw conclusions about the impact of that event on history based on their findings. Judges examine the research for balance of perspectives and balance of types of research evidenced in the bibliography.

The History Day program is structured in a competitive format, but most important are the rewards participants gain from developing skills and new knowledge. "The research, writing and communication skills that students improve by taking part in History Day will help them in all academic endeavors," says Tulare County Superintendent of Schools Jim Vidak. "Students will increase in self-confidence and a sense of accomplishment through their efforts."
