Last week, Julie Westbrook, an education specialist who works at Strathmore Elementary, was named Educator of the Week as part of KSEE24's valley-wide recognition program. Ms. Westbrook, who was surprised by a reporter from the station, was presented with a \$124 gift certificate from GW School Supply. Ms. Westbrook was nominated by Brenda Leyva, a parent of a Strathmore Elementary student.

"I'm not surprised that a parent nominated her for Educator of the Week," said Jennifer Reimer, administrator for Special Services' Mild to Moderate Program. "Julie consistently goes above and beyond to ensure the needs of her students are met, and works with students, staff, and families with ease. She meets every situation with a positive attitude and does not shy away from even the most challenging tasks."

Julie Westbrook has been working at Strathmore Elementary since joining TCOE's Special Services Division in 2016. She works with students who have mild to moderate disabilities, either pulling students out of class to work on academic skills or entering classrooms to provide support within the general education setting.

Ms. Westbrook's story will be featured on KSEE24 News on December 18. She will also be honored at a reception for all 2019-2020 KSEE24 Educators of the Week on May 21 at Fresno State University. An engraved brick with her name will be installed on the Teachers and Friends of Education Honor Wall at Fresno State's Kremen School of Education.

ABC30 special on vaping to air on Sunday

ABC30's *Children First: Vaping Crisis* is scheduled to air Sunday, December 15 at 6:30 p.m. The special will examine the alarming increase in the use of vaping products among children and teens, and the harmful side effects of the practice.

Included in the special is a segment featuring students from Buena Vista School in Tulare. Buena Vista is among several Tulare County schools receiving vape and tobacco education through the Proposition 56 grant received by the CHOICES Program last year. The CHOICES Program presents curriculum on the short- and long-term effects of vape and tobacco use and how tobacco companies target youth to buy and use their products. The curriculum also helps students develop the communication, assertiveness, and conflict resolution skills to say "no" in high pressure situations.

The *Children First* special will also include an interview with Dr. Geetanjali Srivastava, medical director of Emergency Medicine with Valley Children's Hospital, speaking on various potentially-fatal lung conditions seen in patients who vape. Hundreds of preschool children and their parents visited the annual Bright Start Parent/Infant Program holiday gathering on Friday, December 6. Officers from the California Highway Patrol also attended the event to provide parents with proper car seat and booster seat information. The Bright Start Program serves more than 1,000 children, ages 0-3, with home-based services, including physical, occupational, and speech therapies, behavior and feeding therapies, and parent training.
