Katrina Smith, Porterville-Area AcCEL Programs

Ms. Smith has been in the field of special education for over 10 years. She began her career as a Resource Specialist Program (RSP) teacher before teaching within the TCOE AcCEL Program. She was most recently a teacher on special assignment for the AcCEL Program. She will be a program manager for the AcCEL Porterville area, which includes the L.B. Hill Learning Center and 15 special day classes and community based instruction programs.

Ms. Smith holds a Mild/Moderate and a Moderate/Severe Teaching Credential, an Administrative Services Credential, and a master's

ERS Library continues to expand bilingual book collection

Over the past four years, the ERS Library has been growing a collection of Spanish/bilingual books in response to educator demand and classroom need. The collection currently includes over 2,800 books from publishers including Cantata Learning, ABDO Kids Press, Cherry Lake Publishing, and Scholastic. During the 2019-2020 school year, ERS Library Media Technician Maria Ortiz suggested consolidating the Spanish/bilingual books to one area in the library to make it easier for visiting educators to browse the collection. Prior to moving the collection, the books were interspersed throughout the library with English language books on the same subject or by author's last name.

"The Spanish/bilingual books are popular with our dual immersion classroom teachers and we plan to continue adding titles to our collection to meet the growing demand," said Library Media Supervisor Debra Lockwood. Teachers at contracting school sites may reserve these materials for classroom use by accessing Follett Destiny through the ERS Library portal. Tulare County educators who are planning to add Spanish/bilingual books to their school or classroom library and would like to see the books prior to making any purchases are invited to view the collection in the library at TCOE's Doe Avenue complex. To comply with current state and local COVID-19 mitigation efforts, teachers and administrators who wish to view the Spanish/bilingual collection should make a reservation by calling (559) 651-3031 and asking to speak with a library media technician, or by emailing <u>library@ersconnect.org</u>. Titles can also be viewed online using the Follett Destiny ERS Library Online Catalog at gofollett.com and choosing "Educational Resource Services – TCOE, Visalia, CA."
