

Registration now open for Virtual College Night, scheduled for September 8

Registration is now open for TCOE's annual College Night. This year, the event will be virtual with representatives from dozens of colleges and universities available. Students may meet with representatives of their choice, but are encouraged to have questions prepared for their virtual visits.

“Based on our success with virtual teacher recruitment fairs which simulate the look of a convention center-style event, we utilized the same technology to make College Night virtual,” said Tim Hire, Tulare County Superintendent of Schools. “Students and parents will enter the event through a grand lobby before discovering the booths of the representatives in the Exhibit Hall.”



Attendees are required to register at tcoe.org/VirtualCollegeNight. Registration will remain open through September 7. The event will be held on Tuesday, September 8, from 5:00 until 7:00 p.m. Registered students may login to the event as early as 4:00 p.m. to view the virtual lobby, High School Hall, Exhibit Hall, and other exciting features.

The event will also feature breakout sessions covering financial planning, college admissions, and tips on preparing for college. The breakout sessions will be prerecorded and can be viewed at any time during the event.

Districts now have access to powerful data analytics



In an effort to build data capacity within the region, TCOE has launched an exciting new partnership with CORE Districts. Membership in CORE's Data Collaborative provides Tulare County districts access to a robust data platform where they can explore district and site level

dashboards, reports, and strategic analytics dynamically displaying student achievement data, all through the lens of CORE's innovative growth model.

Additionally, CORE has developed a back-to-school analytics tool called Rally that can aid school sites in re-entry and recovery efforts this fall. Rally makes use of all available prior year summative and interim assessment results and will offer teachers and site administrators the ability to track and respond in real time to student needs related to academic growth throughout the coming year. The tool will also monitor each student's well-being through quick, targeted social/emotional learning surveys.

This past spring, TCOE enrolled all 12 districts participating in the Tulare Kings College and Career Collaborative into the CORE data system, and many are currently in the process of setting up their Rally access. Invitations were extended to all districts in the county to join the CORE Data Collaborative. TCOE's Leadership Support Services looks forward to supporting each district joining the CORE Data Collaborative over the course of the next year.
