


### TCOE's annual Student Art Exhibition opens today online



The Student Art Exhibition opens online today with two and a half times the number of pieces as last year's first virtual exhibition. The online exhibition at <u>tcoe.org/ArtGallery</u> features 476 hand drawn and digital works, photographs, and sculptures from 43 Tulare County schools.

"We are so pleased that Tulare County educators continue to make the arts a priority in their classrooms and that they have embraced the online exhibition again this year," said Tim Hire, Tulare County Superintendent of Schools. "I urge readers to visit the exhibition and recognize the positive social-emotional impact the arts have on students."

## **Tulare County runners compete at state**

On Saturday, 20 runners from seven Tulare County schools competed in the CIF State Cross Country Championships at Woodward Park in Fresno. Runners were from Tulare Western High School, El Diamante High School (Visalia), Central Valley Christian High School (Visalia), Porterville High School, Monache High School (Porterville), Summit Charter Collegiate Academy (Porterville), and Farmersville High School.

The boys team from Tulare Western had the county's highest team finish after placing 12th out of 25 teams in the Division III race with 325 points. The Mustangs were led by junior Carter Mendes, who finished 40th with a personal best time of 16 minutes, 7 seconds for the 5,000-meter run. It was the fastest finish by a county runner for the day.

Competing in the Division IV girls race, Farmersville's Julissa Avila had the county's highest individual finish. Avila had a time of 19:06 and placed 31st in a field of 207 runners.

Prior to the state meet was the CIF Central Section Championship meet. At the section championships, Tulare Western boys and Central Valley Christian girls won the Division III and Division V titles, respectively. Individual section champions from Tulare County were Farmersville's Avila in Division IV and Raul Acevedo from Summit Charter in the Division V boys race.
