

Theatre Company unveils plans for two summer performance opportunities



Last week, the Theatre Company announced its plans for two summer performance opportunities with an invitation for students to submit their audition videos May 1 through May 10.

Little Women the Musical will be the featured summer production. Little Women is based on the beloved American coming-of-age novel by American novelist Louisa May Alcott. The story follows the lives of the four March sisters – Meg, Jo, Beth, and Amy – and details their passage from childhood to womanhood.

Theatre Company Director Bethany Rader reports that the production features a small cast, which will allow the directors and students to rehearse while following COVID-19 protocols. Rehearsals will begin June 7 and culminate with filming of the production in early July. A video of *Little Women the Musical* will be released to audiences in late July.

Students may also audition for the summer musical pre-show, *From Page to Stage*. This production, which celebrates literature in musical theatre, will allow students the opportunity to perform solo or in small groups. The performances will be recorded, then streamed as a pre-show just prior to the *Little Women* production.

He has testified before the United States Congress and has worked alongside that body, the US Senate, the White House, the US Department of Education and state departments of education, corporations, and school districts throughout the country to implement student-centered learning. A best-selling author, Mr. Murray serves as a regular conference keynote. He was named the 2018 National/Global EdTech Leader of the Year by EdTech Digest, the 2017 Education Thought Leader of the Year by Texas Computer Education Association, and one of 20 to Watch by National School Boards Association in 2016. His best-selling book, Learning Transformed: 8 Keys to Designing Tomorrow's Schools, Today, co-authored with Eric Sheninger, was released in June 2017. His most recent book, Personal & Authentic: Designing Learning Experiences that Impact a Lifetime, was released in October 2019.
