

## Mary Poppins brings fun and adventure to Tulare County audiences beginning Friday

Banks children, the ad is magically snatched by Mary Poppins, who appears at their front door moments later.

Once Mary becomes the children's nanny, she and her friend, Bert, embark on a series of fantastical adventures with the children, who try to pass on some of their nanny's sunny attitude to their preoccupied parents.

preparation coursework.

program, interns are
supported by programassigned practicum



supervisors and district on-site mentors.
