School Safety Symposium returns as two-day event in April



The School Safety Program has announced the second annual School Safety Symposium will be held April 16-17 at the Visalia Convention Center. Now a two-day event, the symposium is designed for educators and first responders to learn about threat prevention, assessment, and response through a series of inspiring keynote speakers and engaging breakout sessions.

Keynote Presentations

Dominic Syracuse, a behavioral specialist, actor, and comedian, will deliver one of the keynote presentations on “Communicating with Confidence and Connection.” Syracuse blends performance art techniques with neuroscience to teach emotionally intelligent communication in a way that is as entertaining as it is educational.

Christian Moore, founder of WhyTry Inc., author, and Licensed Social Worker, will present “Practical Strategies for Building Resilience in Every Student.” Moore’s WhyTry program is widely used to build resilience in students throughout the nation, including Tulare County. Through his presentation, attendees will discover tools to create safer, more connected schools where every student can thrive.

“Troubled Students: Stories of Challenge & Growth” is the title of a student panel. The panelists will offer insights into their school challenges, what shaped their behavior, and what ultimately helped them change direction.

Breakout Sessions

Over a dozen breakout sessions will be offered on topics ranging from crisis communication and sextortion to student threat assessment and human trafficking. Presenters represent local, state, and national agencies, including the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the California Highway Patrol.
