Integrating ELD in ELA and History-Social Science: Amplifying Language and Content Grades 6-12

This full-day professional learning experience equips grades 6–12 ELA and history–social science educators with the tools to seamlessly integrate English Language Development into their existing curriculum. Grounded in the **California ELD Standards, CCSS for ELA/Literacy, and the California History–Social Science Framework**, the session emphasizes practical strategies that enhance both language development and content mastery for multilingual learners.

Participants will engage in collaborative analysis of their own instructional materials, exploring ways to amplify academic language, deepen student engagement with complex texts, and scaffold meaningful discourse. Through guided planning, teachers will adapt and refine lessons that maintain rigorous content goals while making learning accessible for all students.
