Counselor Clothing and Equipment Checklist

- Sleeping bag or 2 to 3 blankets
- 1 pair pajamas (optional)
- 2 pair of laced walking shoes (no sandals)
- 1 warm jacket or sweater
- 6 pair socks
- 3 pair of pants or jeans (no shorts or capri's of any length)
- 4 shirts (no sleeveless shirts, bare midriffs, low-cuts, or tank tops)
- 4 pair of underwear
- comb or brush
- bath towel
- wash cloth and soap
- toothbrush
- toothpaste
- chapstick
- sunscreen
- insect repellent
- flashlight and batteries
- camera and film (optional)
- homework (if none bring literature book)*
- pillow
- wristwatch (No Smart Watches)
- water bottle (with name on it)

* You will have 2 hours and 15 minutes of mandatory homework time for the week. Be sure to bring homework or a literature book to read during this time. You can request up to 4.5 additional hours of homework time during the week if needed.

Counselors are role models for sixth grade students. Makeup, styling gel, aftershave, perfume and other cosmetic items are not allowed to be brought or used by the sixth-grade students. If these items are brought by a counselor, they must be used minimally and with discretion.

- No articles of clothing which advertise or have overtones of alcohol, tobacco, drugs, gangs, sex or violence.
- Shirts must be long enough to tuck in. (No crop tops)
- No visible tattoos.
- No body piercing jewelry other than in the ear. (This includes tongue jewelry, and any clear plastic piercing's.)
- No cell phones or electronics allowed.

Do Not Bring: vape products, tobacco products, matches or lighters, ipods, ipads, tablets, radios, cell phones, pagers or any electronic item, curling irons (blow dryers are OK), bandanas, sunglasses, magazines or comic books, money, gum, candy or any food products.

Disciplinary action will result for a high school student who brings any of the above-mentioned items. ***Immediate suspension is mandatory, with a recommendation for expulsion, for any student bringing knives (including pocket knives) or any dangerous object, drugs, alcohol or any controlled substance.***
